

**Ian Rowe**

I graduated from the University of Glasgow in 2002 and trained in medicine at Queen's Medical Centre Nottingham. I then moved to Birmingham to train in Liver Medicine and Transplantation. Whilst in Birmingham I was awarded a Medical Research Council Fellowship and was awarded my PhD in 2013. I was then appointed as a Clinical Lecturer in Birmingham before moving to the University of Leeds at the end of 2015 as a new University Academic Fellow to establish a research programme in liver disease. My research interests are primarily in the outcomes of patients with cirrhosis and of patients undergoing liver transplantation. In recognition of achievements in research I was awarded the Andrew Burroughs Young Investigator Award by the British Liver Transplant Group in 2016. My clinical expertise is in the management of patients with primary liver cancer (hepatocellular carcinoma, HCC) and patients with viral hepatitis.
